A NEW SHOPPING MALL IN GROOTFONTEIN



The design for the new Grootfontein Town Centre shopping mall is at an advanced stage – feedback has been received from large national retailers, as well as from a number of local Grootfontein businesses, and these ideas/changes are being added to the design of the centre.

Says developer Paulo Shipoke: "At the moment the centre will be approximately 7 000sqm in size, anchored by a large supermarket and numerous fashion retailers. The aim is to provide shoppers from Grootfontein (and further afield) with a number of new stores, more variety than ever and convenient access. A new petrol station (with a linked restaurant), taxi rank and numerous other facilities are planned, and the shopping mall will tie in to the existing retailers in town via a grand extension of Hage Geingob Avenue."

Shipoke says some earthworks on the site will start before year-end, given that a level platform has to be created for the centre to be neatly on one level. "And if at all possible, we'd like to have the new shops open for Christmas 2013" says Shipoke, "so that the retailers can have their goods on sale for the holiday period, giving the people of Grootfontein extra choices over the festive Season." The developer will shortly be engaging the town council to share the finer details of the scheme, and how they will fit into and benefit Grootfontein.

A NEW SECONDARY SCHOOL IS UNDER CONSTRUCTION IN GROOTFONTEIN



The new secondary school is under construction in Grootfontein. The project so far has created more than 250 indirect jobs to the residents of the town. The school will accommodated learners from Grade 8-12. It will also look into the possibility to build a hostel for the learners that does not have accommodation in Grootfontein in future. The school form part of the government long strategic plans such as vision 2030 and to promote capacity building to the people at the bottom of the pyramid. The project fall under the Ministry of Education, in order to meet the demands of society and to improve resources of schools in towns. The school will open its doors for operations during the beginning of 2014.

PARLIAMENT COMMITTEE VISITED GROOTFONTEIN



The National Assembly standing committee on Economics, Natural Resources and Public Administration pay a courtesy call to Grootfontein. Cllr. J. Spangeberg wellcome the visitors and highlightt on the growth prospects of the town. They also took a view on the current development and projects and activities related to agriculture, tourism, industries, mining, Small and Medium Enterprises (SME's) and community self-help initiatives in the town.

CLUSTER WORSHOP ON LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMNET





This workshop is the first of its kind and was conducted on the 21-22 August at the Makalani Hotel in Tsumeb. The Workshop was focusing on establishing cooperation between the town councils and development agencies in the economic cluster commonly known as the Maize triangle. The small towns are the engines of the economic growth of the country. A committee will be formed to monitor identified projects in the cluster. A cluster cultural show will also be envisaged to show case products and services offered by the three towns. Representatives of the three towns identified 15 areas of potential co-operation that included setting up a cluster radio station and newspaper. Also high on the agenda is the establishment of an integrated logistics hub for the storage and repackaging of container cargo (dry port) as well as a truck stop. In order to make this a reality the three towns decided to launch a special purpose company to make the vision a reality. All three towns occupy strategic positions on major national arterial routes.

The new cluster approach will see the towns working together to diversify and increase agriculture and agri-processing. Co-operation between emerging and commercial farmers will be systematically encouraged. Agricultural projects include the following:

Looking into the feasibility of olive and almond farming and the production of olive oil, Increasing groundnut production, Increasing the cultivation and milling and packaging of the popular "mahangu" grain, Recycling water for agricultural usage and Tapping into large underground water reservoirs for the production of vegetables for the national market

A new tourism route will be developed and marketed and will include the numerous historic sites, natural attractions, meteorites and cultural sites. "We intend to broaden the tourism offering in the area so that visitors to Etosha and Game farms can enjoy the rich variety of our cluster. We all have something to offer tourists," said the Honourable Mayor of Tsumeb Mr. N. Shetekela. The NCCI is looking at establishing a sub-chamber with business representatives from all three towns forming a joint chamber.

Another joint initiative will see the three towns in the cluster co-operating to produce electricity and gas from solid waste and looking at solar energy production. Delegates are also hoping that vocational training institutes and universities will consider establishing local campuses in the cluster.

The delegates to the meeting voiced concern at the lack of local value adding to mineral resources like copper and gold, and committed themselves to look at small scale manufacturing of jewellery. Electrical component manufacture using copper also came under the spotlight: "We need to make use of central government incentives and build local manufacturing capacity so that the economy is more inclusive." said the Honourable Mayor of Otavi Mr. M. Damaseb.

THE CONSTRUCTION OMULUNGA INDUSTRIAL PARK IN GOOD PROGRESS



The Municipality of Grootfontein in collaboration with NDC and the Ministry of Trade and industry are busy constructing an SME Park known as Omulunga Industrial Park. The project aims to promote small medium enterprises in the town. This will also help the community members to be creative and innovative in order to generate income by utilizing these resources. SME is the engines of socio-economic growth of the town and the country as a whole.
